

[00:00:00] Hi, I'm stage and stage's Lin-Manuel Miranda and you're listening to The Hamilcast.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:00:18] Hey, friends, it's Gillian. Welcome back to the Hamilcast. This is my second episode with Wesley Ryan from the Angelica tour. Check out last week's episode if you haven't already. That's where Wesley talks about going from being the shy kid to booking a Jason Robert Brown musical on Broadway as a teenager. Plus moving all over the world to make theater. And of course, we talked about the viral self tape compilation with their cat, Odie. But if you're all caught up, I'll leave you to it. Here's part two of my conversation with Wesley. Enjoy.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:00:52] OK, so wait, you're first. Tell me about your first thought, is it was it was it one of those like the Yorktown Dance Packet?

Wesley Ryan [00:00:59] There was an open. I think it was an ECC... an Equity chorus call. And so I went in with the rest of them. There was like 120 guys that they broke us down into groups of 30. And each group of 30 probably had anywhere from like five to 17 people that got called back to like either do another round of dance or sing. I think I sung that first day we did the choreography and then I sung, waited a week. I heard like it was like on a Wednesday. The following Monday, I got a callback to come back and again, where we redid my shot and then added on Room and then sung. And then another week goes by and I did my shot and room and Yorktown and blah blah. After five weeks of going back and back and forth for these callbacks, also alternating with the Mean Girls national tour at the time, like every week I was in, it was like Tuesday and Wednesday. I was in for those two things every week and was like, Oh my gosh, one of these things has to happen, please. Yeah. The last day it was a, think my call, I think my audition was 10:30 at 5:30. We had



the last cut PM when the last like cut done and it was down to me. They asked me and two other guys to stay to do the like, flare section of the Yorktown Corio. And at that point, I was like, Wow, there's only three men. And it was for an immediate replacement for four, one of the companies. And I was like, Am I going to like this? I'm close like, This is crazy. And then never heard anything. And so I was like, OK, that's fine. I've got work booked. I went to Chicago and in West Side, I went to Sacramento and then, you know, in the heights. And then, yeah, I got back to New York. And two weeks later, they called out of the clear blue sky clear blue, which means one of those. I hope that the third guy also got a contract somewhere for Hamilton because I may not have been a replacement for that contract, but I was the replacement for this one. And this list, you know, you're on a list somewhere if you get that far.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:03:06] I was going to say like, I know it doesn't. It might not help in the moment, but like sometimes you're always on a list or sometimes like they don't know what they're looking for yet. And if they like you, I know it sucks. And I know I'm sure there's a better way for sure. And hindsight is 20 20. But it's

Wesley Ryan [00:03:20] Well I think mostly it was like, you hear like, you know, we'll keep your headshot on fire, but will you though, right? Are you really going to give my headshot on file? And they do? Right? This is proof that they really do. You know? Yeah, yeah. And it all worked out how it was supposed, to be honest. Honestly, I'm just very thankful that I got my foot in the door when I did because I was one of the first things that about a month after we had shut down for the pandemic, we had a company, Zoom, with all five of us productions of Hamilton. It was like 600 people on a Zoom and one of our strings players for our our band asked, like, you know, there's five companies like Do you do you really think that feasibly you're going to get five companies back up post-pandemic whenever that is able to



be? And our producer, Jeffrey Seller, was like, there is more demand than I have supply for it, because not only did we cancel all of these cities that still need to get played, we have the cities that were already projected in that time that still need to get played. All five productions will be operating. So like in April, we didn't know when it was going to be able to happen, but we all knew that we had jobs to come back in April 2020.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:04:32] April 2020 you're hearing this

Wesley Ryan [00:04:33] Right. Yeah. And we didn't return until August of 2021. But we all knew that whenever it was safe to do so, we were going to be able to come back to our jobs, which is, you know, something that so many people did not get. Oh yeah, it was a nice piece of mind. Plus, I hadn't lived in one place and like a decade at this point. So to get to be home in L.A. with family and like my childhood friends, I didn't get to spend six months there like it was. And another blessing that I didn't know that I needed, albeit for this horrific situation, but, you know, finding silver linings is one of the only ways through.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:05:13] Yeah, I want to get back to your take talk for a second because there's this amazing tick tock of yours, one of your viral ones. You know, no big deal. You're sliding down the stairs during the Schuyler sisters. Oh yes, the caption is if y'all only knew what goes on behind the scenes at Hamilton? Yeah, I mean, we'd love to know. So what? So if you could describe that? And then just if there are any like other fun tidbits about

Wesley Ryan [00:05:36] oh my goodness, the show behind the show is. Equally, as intricate, you know, playing around a side. The things that need to get done, I mean, are our wardrobe heads that have to get, you know, the local wardrobe. They've got these like note cards about an inch and a half thick. But they flip no by no to know where they have to go. Those poor people



who just like are shot out of a cannon, never knowing what to say.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:06:02] Thank you to them, everyone when you see them.

Wesley Ryan [00:06:04] Yes. And tip your dressers. Tip your dressers. But yeah, so that alone that all those things that go on. But like, yeah, I have got for that part that I post that video for. I like grab these planks and roll of moving around with like the working class of New York City. I like shake hands with Tyler Bellow, who plays our Mulligan Madison. And then I've got about five seconds to get down the stairs and back in, like on stage like slide under that same plank. And one day I realized I just had my gloves on and grabbed onto that railing. I could just slide right down faster than trying to like pitter patter down these stairs. So I just I started doing that and I asked one of our our props people on stage left prop Serena if she would record it sneakily. And she did. And I passed it and I just kept going. I was like, Holy Moly. But yeah, I mean, there's moments where before wait for it, I don't come in until like halfway through the ensemble vocal. So we have a new woman. Her name is yasya. She plays our woman one I just like. She stands up against me, have the alcove in the back like the walkway to get out, and she stands up against it on the stage left side and she's on her back like her shoulder up against us. And no one can see from like behind the wall. So all I go and like, put my finger like in her, we call our our cream-colored pops the parchment. I was like, put my finger in and like like pull on. It's like tugs her shoulder and we just like messing with each other backstage any way you can like. I mean, even on stage, though, the play, it really is a playground and we're giant children. Just like doing this job.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:07:41] Yeah, well, the listeners are going to be very excited to hear that because usually we hear



that from the Philip company. So it's nice to know also that the Angelica Company

Wesley Ryan [00:07:49] Games, games get played. We play tag on stage. If like if I'm in, you know, in the tavern scene and I change my, I go sit on the stool across a woman three and like, before I get up, I'll go for it. And then it's like, You just go. You go on. She's now it. She can go tag whoever she wants. You have to say you're as so the person knows either. That's why you're touching them

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:08:10] thank you to the sound people for turning the mics off at that right time so that you're right.

Wesley Ryan [00:08:14] It's also, yes, it's also knowing when your mic is on and off. That's enough. Or you know that you know, you're like quietly. So no one hears that in other shows I played pass the penny. So that brings a penny on stage. And like you, I put it in somebody's hand, and now you have to pass it to somebody else, like games get played or will do like in four guns and ships. We all get to ad lib our like first little entrance, like so after America's favorite fighting Frenchman... At all of that improv. But is it ... So we can do whatever dance things you want? I do like for it turns people do like a kip up, like whatever you want. Some days we'll have a scene where it's like selfies and photographs and say, You're like... And you like snap pictures of yourself. Like little ways to get through, like the show is already so fun and finding ways to continue to bolster that. Like, obviously, the audience doesn't even know that it's happening, but the energy is received and like they get so into it just because we're having a good time. And like, you know, we get asked all the time, you know, I can't imagine doing the same show eight times a week for like six months. Like, do you get bored? And I'm like, bored, bored. I have a three hour show to do, and every show is different, whether it be whether playing around or a swing goes on for a new track or



my dance partner is sick that day. So I have one of our female swings on dance with somebody new that's so boring, like every show is different. Even if we say and dance the exact same thing every night, you know

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:09:44] or someone passes you a penny or you're it

Wesley Ryan [00:09:47] your it. Exactly, exactly. It's just it's a we have a good time.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:09:51] I'm still blown away by Andy with the hallway move and room. Like all those little things

Wesley Ryan [00:09:56] Oh my qosh, just so many of those. There's so many of us and like our dance captains, do a fantastic job of its kind of as much of its sensory overload to watch the show. It's sensory overload to learn it because not only are they're giving you choreography, they're giving you attention. And it's like when we when when the ensemble first comes out on the opening, no other word got around like, you're like, you're not just putting your hand in your ear to listen, like it's more convincing to not look where you're going and to be like, you know, like when you're eavesdropping, you're not looking at the person, like eavesdropping on them. You're like pretending like you're doing something else. And that's the intention. That's what draws your ear for it. It's like things like that that, like, are so well thought out. It's the beautiful thing. It's a beautiful thing to do. So beautiful thing to learn, albeit. In the rehearsal process, Burr, like I think it was a nice thing about being back post-pandemic is that we got four weeks of rehearsal where all of us rehearse together. We were all brand new, quote unquote for lack of a better phrase together, which is something that does not happen because after so we're all on a year contract. After that year, people are going to come and go in different increments. You



know, someone's contract is going to start in September or someone else's one starts October, which means that their year, you know, people are going to be coming and going and. In succession, in different timeframes, and we're never we don't get that, especially on tour, you don't get to rehearse as a company coming into a show that's already built. And so that was an incredible moment for all of us to get to have together because we've got to share that unlike Remount, this thing that we love together and like really hand-in-hand together. Yeah, tears were shed and our rehearsal process, just like, you know, I struggled a lot about an apartment in New York City. Congratulations of last year. Thank you. Thank you. I'm very excited. We're actually having it renovated right now. We had to fight our contractor on Tuesday. It's OK. I'm not sure it's going to be fun. It's supposed to be five weeks. It has been seven months, but it's fine. It's fine. We're fine, everything's fine. Everything's fine.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:12:00] This is this is the last bit of change that you were talking about.

Wesley Ryan [00:12:03] Exactly. Coming back to tour this time, I was like, You know, I I haven't gotten to live in one place like I did during the pandemic for my entire adult life. It was hard to leave that behind again, especially having bought this apartment that I want. I bought it because I want to limo right now. Yeah, yeah. So to go back out on the road, it was like not a difficult decision. It's a job that I've been waiting to come back to. I only got to be in in it on stage for two and a half months before we shut down. But I was just hyper aware of what I was giving up this time and it made it harder to return. And so we had moments in rehearsals where we all got to talk about, you know, the duality. Two things can be true. I can be thankful to be back here and have this job and to be surrounded by such incredibly talented, kind human beings. I can also want to be somewhere else. And it's not a bad thing, you know? Yeah, I



before coming back and even after being back, there was a lot of guilt in that feeling because I was like, there are people that would kill at the drop of a hat to be in my shoes. And here I am, even remotely unhappy, like, wow, I'm so bad, you know? But recognizing that no, like I am beyond grateful and thankful to be back on this stage and to be back doing this show. I also know that I love my apartment and I love living in it. I love building my home. And you know, you have to choose. You make decisions. Sometimes that comes. Not everything is always going to be hunky dory and sunshine and rainbows like there are two sides to it.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:13:41] Yeah, and that's OK. I mean, you worked hard for that apartment. You care about it. You're going to be there with your person. I mean, that's very important. That's all. Totally valid. All of it.

Wesley Ryan [00:13:51] Yeah, for sure. Yeah. But you know, the things that I didn't have to think about before because before, you know, it was very much like, I am lucky to have been chosen. I was on earlier. I'm lucky to have been chosen for this show. I'm going to give up anything to do this. And now it's like, I'm not. I'm not willing to give up anything. It's time I'm willing to give up a lot of things. There's going to be sacrifices that need to be made. However, this does not go above my well-being or my life anymore. And that is a that's a huge change that, you know, I think in this industry doesn't get talked about a lot. I think a lot of people post-pandemic are figuring that out. What am I willing to sacrifice and what am I not willing to sacrifice for this.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:14:35] RIght. Because I was just going to ask you, actually, you said earlier, you know, pre-pandemic and we'll get back to that. I mean, is this is sort of what you're talking about. We're saying pre pandemic, it's we're still in it. We're still it's not March 2020, when nobody knew when we



were washing our groceries and everything was a little more unknown, is what we're saying. We're still very much in it and we know that.

Wesley Ryan [00:14:55] Yes. Yes, yes.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:14:57] Yes. Get vaccinated. Get posted.

Wesley Ryan [00:14:58] Yes, get back to the loose and wear your mask. If you're not like,

Gillian Pensavalle [00:15:01] yeah, and then maybe one of these days will be post-pandemic. Yeah, but yeah. So I mean, there's been everything we were saying before about, you know, Charlotte and the head of the Broadway League and all of this stuff like these conversations that are happening at the conversations about race and the conversations about inclusion and equity, not the union, but equity in shows. And, you know, queer people and trans people and gay people are just representation. There's like a lot that happened just and that I'm talking about just in the theater industry, right?

Wesley Ryan [00:15:31] Right. I mean, before over the summer, there was a lot of a lot of conversations about the league and and equity. And you're hearing these stories of black girls that were told they couldn't wear their natural hair because they needed to look more like the white girl that played the role originally. You know, like you hear these things that these microaggressions that before. Again, we don't think twice about, OK, I can't wear my natural hair. I've got I've got to fit this mold of this thing. But now it's like, Wait, wait, why can't that character be black? Why can't that character be anything other than what the original person was like? It doesn't say explicitly anywhere in the script like that. This is, you know, because. Of this, you know, you have shows like The Color



Purple. People have to be black. You cannot have a white person playing these roles. I mean, please do hairspray.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:16:18] Was it there that that high school in Missouri who did hairspray? And it's like, Oh my God, what is happening? Why is there like a white seaweed? What is happening, right?

Wesley Ryan [00:16:26] One thing in the back of the marriage? What are you doing? Oh my goodness. Because things are like in certain areas there, there weren't consequences for we weren't having to think that way. You know, it was just it was for the love of theater. It was for just the fun of doing it. So, OK, there's a way to have fun and is also a way to be respectful and do. It needs to be done. And I checked all those conversations. You know, there is plenty of like equity and and union marches in New York City. When I was there over the summer last year just to speak out, there are a lot of people that are no longer going to just sit back because this is the way that it was. It doesn't have to be that way and it shouldn't be that way, and it won't be that way if we have anything to say about it. Exactly. Things have to evolve with the times again, like you said, just because it was just cause. And it really wasn't even working before, but no one was talking about it. It's just that, as I said, when I go to working in mad air quotes, just because it was working right doesn't mean that it should

Gillian Pensavalle [00:17:24] People felt like I don't want to. I don't want to be the one to rock the boat. And now everyone's like, happy to rock the boat.

Wesley Ryan [00:17:29] And so for so many people of color, if they rock the boat that's being blacklisted in the industry, they'll never work again. So you either shut up and take what's been given to you because you should be thankful that you're even at this opportunity to have an opportunity or you rock the



boat and lose everything. So most people just sat quietly and suffered in silence or talk to their colleagues of color and whatever else and complain to them because that's all we could do. But yeah, you know, I think that's one of the other things that I do love about this company is that there are so many conversations being had this time coming around. We all got asked what we wanted to do with our hair. That was not the case before. Excellent. How do you how do you want to wear it? How do you want to style it? One of my friends, my partner and I actually lived with her in the last couple of cities. She is our woman, five, and she also covers all three Schuyler sisters, a talent.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:18:21] What's her name?

Wesley Ryan [00:18:22] Lencia Kebede

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:18:22] Oh, great. I'd love to talk to her.

Wesley Ryan [00:18:23] Oh my gosh, she is a joy and a half to talk to. But her Eliza wiq this time around is box braids, which is just like gorgeous, long, beautiful box braids that would not have been an option before she would have had probably some straight, wavy Eliza wig, you know? And now she's actually able to wear a hairstyle that is appropriate for her culture, her skin, her like everything you know, she. And that's because of those conversations as they are listening in and putting their best foot forward. Because especially in a show like this where there are so many BIPOC, you know, actors on that stage at any given moment, right? The representation of it all. One of our Kendall Yokoyama, she is one of our female principle covers. She covers Woman, five and all three sisters. She has this cute little. She's Japanese, has this cute little space buns that she gets to wear like a like culture appropriate. You know, I just love that they are, including all these things now and in their



decision making and design of the show, because it absolutely should be. This is what the world looks like, you know

Gillian Pensavalle [00:19:29] right? It's what the world looks like. And also everyone's looking at Hamilton. So not to quote Hamilton to Hamilton, but history has its eyes on you. So everyone is watching you and cares about you. And like people are still discovering the show thanks to Disney Plus. And I know that for a fact because people are discovering this podcast. Six years into it, because, oh, I just got it on Disney Plus or oh my friend, oh, I finally caved because I thought it couldn't live up to the hype. And now they're going down the rabbit hole of finding things. I'm like, Yeah, that's all important.

Wesley Ryan [00:19:55] The obsession continues. Also, keep the obsession now going. That's why I have a job.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:19:59] Thank you. Please thank you so much. But also, like, do the right thing always like set the example as the biggest show on Earth right now. You get

Wesley Ryan [00:20:07] to set that precedent, right?

Gillian Pensavalle [00:20:08] Like how nice?

Wesley Ryan [00:20:09] Yeah, for sure.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:20:10] For sure. Speaking of nice things, Wesley, are you ready to take some questions from the Patreon Peeps?

Wesley Ryan [00:20:16] Oh, that's all the questions. Let's go. I'm ready

Gillian Pensavalle [00:20:48] Anya is asking she says, well, first of all, she says, can't wait to see you with the Angelica



tour in North Carolina, so make sure you look familiar. She's bringing it back a question we love to ask to ensemble members or anyone, really? What do you yell during a room? The company screams in chaos. Where to put the capital? I always used to hear Toronto, but no one says Toronto.

Wesley Ryan [00:21:09] I would change. I'll start with what I used to do and what I do now. I hope I don't get in trouble for what I'm about to say. I used to scream all sorts of things. Sometimes it would be the city that we're in, even though it's not historically accurate. Like, Tempe didn't exist when it did, but not in terms of a.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:21:32] One of the 13 colonies. And it's no as long as Kirk Crowley's happy with the Toronto or like right.

Wesley Ryan [00:21:38] As long as it's finally got a couple of syllables and you cut out star and cut off at the right time. Currently, I look at David Parker plays are laughing at Jefferson, and I just go one of them, which is really what it is. Sometimes I'll say his name. I'll say David Park. I mean, often I'll say a city, but more often, like, I'll just whatever he stands right for me. I'm on the stairs and like my arms around. He's standing right in front of me, so usually I do something to him. I've said Brooklyn

Gillian Pensavalle [00:22:07] Thats a good one. Yeah.

Wesley Ryan [00:22:08] I've said Virginia.

Wesley Ryan [00:22:10] Sometimes I say Rhode Island, just because no one's getting in the capital and tiny little island. Honestly, whatever comes in my mind in that moment, and it's different every night. Well, that's the nice thing about that



moment, too, is it's like it's not set in stone. We get to like change,

Gillian Pensavalle [00:22:22] and that's fine. Like, I remember talking to the film company in Vegas. There was that was when Black Panther came out, so Wakanda was a big answer. I know that Neil Haskell would say, your mom's house.

Wesley Ryan [00:22:33] We had one of our cast members say that and then somebody offstage hurt him and told him what

Gillian Pensavalle [00:22:39] he might have been told on on this podcast. Neil has have to be on, but I Javon McFerran would sometimes like it. Sometimes it's a very cultural whatever's happening in the moment, like Javon McFerran, said Cafe. Yeah, that was a big what's his name? Tweet his name anymore. But no, it was just, you know, something funny that's happening again. Just like, I don't know. Have a little fun with it because it is a three.

Wesley Ryan [00:23:01] Another reason why the show doesn't get boring,

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:23:03] like it's like the verbal equivalent of passing a penny or tagging someone.

Wesley Ryan [00:23:07] Yes. Yes, yes. Yes.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:23:09] Tanya's also asking What is your dream role in Hamilton if it's not the one you already play? And is there another dream role in a dream show?

Wesley Ryan [00:23:17] Yes, I have a number of them. So in this show in particular, I think I'd be a Laf/Jefferson track would be a dream role of mine.



Gillian Pensavalle [00:23:27] I can see that totally.

Wesley Ryan [00:23:28] Fiero as a dream role of mine. I would love to play Fiero. Simba, and the main stage production of Lion King would be another one I would love to. My absolute dream role would be to originate something it doesn't matter what that is. I would love to be a part of a new musical where I get to set it, and it's written on me and, you know, kind of build this character from from the ground up. That would be the ideal dream role, whatever that looks like. But for four already existing musicals, I'd say Benny, In The Heights, Lafayette, Jefferson, Feiro and Simba.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:24:08] Oh, you got to call me for all those because I will be there. I mean, you're going to kill all of them.

Wesley Ryan [00:24:14] Your lips to God's ears. Let's make them all happen.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:24:16] Okay, let's do it. Thanks. I'm an amen, grandma. I could do that.

Wesley Ryan [00:24:21] Listen, honestly, just as long as there's someone else in my corner rooting for it and putting that energy out there, let me tell you,

Gillian Pensavalle [00:24:26] this is going to live forever. We just put it out there. You never know who's going to hear it. It's just going to live forever. So that will be repeated many times.

Wesley Ryan [00:24:35] So let's get let's let's get after it.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:24:37] Kelly says Wesley is a stunning dancer, stunning in all caps. When I saw him recently in Dallas



and Fort Worth, he continually caught my eye with his gorgeous extension and execution. I would love to know more about his process for developing their ensemble character. You can definitely tell there's intention in the movement.

Wesley Ryan [00:24:58] Yes, Kelly, first of all, thank you for that incredible compliment. Oh my goodness, I am. Any time that anyone even is able to pick me out of the chaos and compliments me on, that is a absolute blessing and makes my heart flutter. So thank you

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:25:12] Get ready because there's a whole list of them now.

Wesley Ryan [00:25:17] As for intention and things there and teaching the show, they're very specific about what the intention is. Our execution of that intention is up to us. So for example, in the opening number, when we when when Hamilton takes out his coat and, you know, Eliza puts his jacket on him and he's like getting ready to go on this adventure, we're told that we are supposed to keep our eyes on Hamilton. Now you can keep your eyes on Hamilton in off him. You can keep your eyes on Hamilton. For whatever the reason is, I have a personal character logline throughout the whole show where I'm against Hamilton, every every cabinet battle, I disagree with him. I clap for Jefferson every single time. Like it doesn't matter what it is. I'm not on Hamilton's side

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:26:03] no matter who's playing Hamilton, no matter what. You're just no.

Wesley Ryan [00:26:06] You know, I'll occasionally I'll switch it up and I'll be like, You know what? That was a good thing. He's right, but that's rare. And the opening number, like, I have my eyes on him, like, who is this guy that has moved here and like, What is it? What, what is that? What like what? What



is that person? Yeah, I mean, I don't know if there's anything necessarily like. Rhyme or reason or like deep down character development, because really, our character as ensemble changes dependent a lot of times where where the physical manifestation of the inside thoughts of these characters as they go on. But even in that moment, if I'm the inside thought of Hamilton's brain and that stuff down, some people are, you know what I mean, like some people are the affirmation. The confidence, like I'm the one was like, Well, what if you don't make it? What if it's like, senator? It's like, Am I projecting that I was going to say things like that? You know, little, little ways that

Gillian Pensavalle [00:26:58] that, yeah, that voice like pushing him. Keep writing because you're going to your nose. Like, really just maybe the devil on his shoulder.

Wesley Ryan [00:27:05] Why are you doing this? Yeah, you know.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:27:07] You know what you should do.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:27:07] You should write that pamphlet because you never know. Just put the whole Reynolds stuff. Just put it out

Wesley Ryan [00:27:11] there, you know, and it'll it'll benefit you.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:27:13] I promise this is a good idea. Just write

Wesley Ryan [00:27:15] it. Yeah, yeah, yeah. And give your son those guns.

And we're dancing to girls. It's like all these things. And then there's the satisfied, which is the same choreography, but like just conjoined head and like broken and. And not as smooth, because that's Angelica experience, that's one of my favorite numbers to perform a for the Rewind, but also just like the storytelling of that moment of these two, because it really is the same number, just told their different lens and like to get to see that in. On stage and play out every night and to be a part of every night is, as is paramount here.

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:28:47] She's also asking what is your favorite number to watch others perform?

Wesley Ryan [00:28:52] Oh, when I'm not on stage or when I am on stage, let's do both. OK, Schuyler sisters, if I'm not on stage, it's one of the. There's a lot of full company moments, but like, that's one where every single person is involved in this segment and telling this part of the story where you've got



characters from all walks of life, you have the upper echelon. So like the working class and like, everybody is telling their their story in that moment. My favorite to watch when I'm on stage, it's hard. I really like watching. We know not much happens, but like I'm sitting on the stage right stares and I can see everybody like people on the surround like Stephanie. Irma, who is our Angelica, is like directly crossing me up on the surround and I can see everybody. But like the four men in the room, I just think that the four of them do an incredible job. And just like that sequence of I actually just asked. So we have a resident choreographer that travels with us, name's Ashley. And I asked her recently, I was like, And we know, do we know the secret before he gets in there?

**Gillian Pensavalle** [00:30:02] I know that they know that. We know that they.

Wesley Ryan [00:30:04] Right, right. Exactly. But how much do I know?

And actually, that's really the only dancing and even Reynolds pamphlets like whatever you want to do, it's pretty much ad lib minus a couple of moments. But I would say act one. Yeah, hard. It's harder for sure, but definitely of the two, I prefer to do act one, and it makes it seem like it goes faster because there's more going on.

But then I couldn't stop watching you for the entire show. She says I saw the show again the next week and you were there in the beginning, but you must have had to leave around helpless/satisfied because wait for it only had three



ensemble members on stage instead of four and then stay alive. Had Avery in your place. Were you injured during the show?

Wesley Ryan [00:32:23] Oh my goodness, I cannot believe that somebody noticed that, yes. I was. I injured my back. Very badly, I was out of the show for almost 10 days. Yeah, it was. And really, I've been having some like back issues. I mean, we do the shows three hours long. There's an incredible wear and tear on our bodies, repetitive movements, all of all of the above. And during a couple of satisfied, well, it's Satisfied. We still like the boys, step past the girls and like, bend over under their arms and like we said, back up number one. And when I stood up, my backpack went into spasm and I was like, couldn't even like I couldn't bend over and I was like, Wow, I'm getting all old, I bent over. And I couldn't stand back up.

months that I was on my contract. So if I blow my back out, you know, in this one show and now I'm screwed. You know, there's there's no coming back from that. Whereas if I just took the time to rest for a show, then then I have more longevity in this, you know

Well, the show can still go on. Avery is one of our incredibly talented swings that can is perfectly capable of going onto my track, and he did.

Gillian Pensavalle [00:34:53] Carol Lee also says no one can rock a red gown like you did at the rally ball last October. Delmar, what? Keep doing what you do. You're making a difference in the world. Please explain what this ball is
